
50 YEARS OF HIP HOP IN THE BRONX

When Cindy Campbell asked her brother Clive, better known as DJ Kool Herc, to throw her a back-to-school party on August 11, 1973 in the Recreation Room of 1520 Sedgwick Avenue, neither could have known that this event would be an early catalyst for the global arts and music movement we now know as hip hop. This Kool Herc party, like countless other block and recreation center parties in The Bronx at the time, provided teenagers and young adults a safe place to hang out and get down to good music and dancing. The major difference with Herc's early parties was that they were a notch above many others at the time, with a louder sound system, more hot records carefully curated for percussive breaks, and a group of regular dancers hand-selected by Herc to keep the groove going strong. The musical genres featured at these parties were enjoyed by many Bronxites at the time: soul, funk, salsa, R&B, and rock. Popular dances included uprocking, the Latin Hustle, and others in vogue in The Bronx of the early 1970s.

Similar parties were happening around the same time in fits and spurts around the borough, especially in the Bronxdale Houses under the creative guidance of Disco King Mario (1956-1994). These Bronx parties began to take off in a way nobody could have predicted. As Herc and other DJs began to fine-tune their craft and add more elements to the mix-talking to the crowd to pump them up ("MCing"), various turntable techniques, increasingly bold dance moves—the parties had to move to larger venues like parks, public school auditoriums, and other community centers. Within a few years, these highly creative, multi-sensory parties had mushroomed around the borough, with a new generation of DJs like Grandmaster Flash, Afrika Bambaataa, and Grand Wizzard Theodore.

Various Bronx DJs claim responsibility for the original coining of the term


"hip hop" in the late 1970s-Lovebug Starski, Cowboy, and DJ Hollywood-but only gradually did the term become widespread, after The Sugar Hill Gang's "Rapper's Delight" came out in 1979 and when Afrika Bambaataa started using "hip hop" to describe the cultural movement in the early 1980s.

Bambaataa also devised the classical "four elements" scheme of hip hop: DJing, MCing, break dancing, and graffiti, the first two of which are what people today think of as "rap." In 1973, however, the majority of these hip hop elements were still gradually coming into being-aside, that is, from graffiti, then known simply as "writing." By 1973-1974, writers had moved from doing simple tags on walls, vans, and buses to creating increasingly elaborate pieces-short for "masterpieces"-on the outside of subway trains. As with all things hip hop, the locus of this major development in graffiti technique was The Bronx, home to many of the earliest masters of style.

Although each of the elements of hip hop has now become a global commodity, little credit has been given to the mass of Bronx teenagers of the 1970s who gave hip hop its original style and ethos. That is fortunately changing, thanks in part to the Bronx Aerosol Arts Documentary Project and other initiatives we are rolling out at The Bronx County Historical Society.
